

# Greater Springfield welcomes highway investment – 10.10.12



Access to Greater Springfield will be even quicker and easier thanks to the Queensland Government's decision to double capacity on a section of the Centenary Highway.

Springfield Land Corporation Managing Director Bob Sharpless said an extra two lanes between Springfield Parkway and Johnson Road at Greenbank, three bridges and a new on-ramp from Logan Motorway will help relieve traffic congestion for thousands of motorists during peak hours.

"This announcement from Transport Minister Scott Emerson is good news for Greater Springfield's rapidly growing population and will complement the \$475 million Springfield rail project which is on track to open next year, putting Brisbane just down the line," Mr Sharpless said.

"It's already quicker to drive from central Brisbane to Springfield than to any other neighbourhood within a 30-35 kilometre radius of the CBD."

Data from Google Maps, WhereiS.com and RACQ shows it takes on average about 31 minutes to reach Springfield but 50 minutes to Redcliffe, 44 minutes to Victoria Point, 39 minutes to North Lakes and 48 minutes to Kholo.

Mr Sharpless said Greater Springfield is all about providing world class infrastructure to support a world class lifestyle.
