

Greater Springfield's newest suburb was officially launched

Springfield Rise at Spring Mountain is Lend Lease's newest address for the western corridor. Nestled between Springfield Central's booming town centre and White Rock-Spring Mountain Conservation Estate, it connects directly to Lend Lease's first community, the award-winning Springfield Lakes. It will fuse the beauty of the natural environment with the convenience of a modern urban community creating places to live, learn, work and play right from day one.

Maha Sinnathamby, City visionary, welcomed the Deputy Premier Minister for Transport and Minister for Infrastructure, Hon Jackie Trad, who, as guest of honor, cut the ribbon.

According to Maha, the construction of Springfield Rise at Spring Mountain was yet another job generator for the region. The additional four thousand homes will be well received by the many families wanting to move to Australia's newest city.

There will be approximately 4,000 homes on the 415 hectare site comprising more than 50 hectares of open space which includes natural linear reserves , kilometres of walking and hiking tracks and cycling paths connecting to the Springfield CBD, the districts biggest sporting fields , 13 local parks, and three district parks.

"Springfield Rise at Spring Mountain is a great opportunity to be part of a master planned community with amenities that create great places and with residents able to enjoy the amenity of Springfield Lakes," said Matthew Wallace, Managing Director of Lendlease's Communities business.

Jackie Trad, Deputy Premier and Minister for Infrastructure and Planning, said that in the coming years, the region would be a significant driver of jobs and economic development.

"This new community will deliver 675 construction jobs per year over the next ten years and more than 500 ongoing jobs once completed.

"This is fantastic news for the local economy in Ipswich and the investments here really demonstrate the confidence in this region.

"We know that the Springfield area is going from strength to strength with people recognising that it's a great place to live, work and raise families," Ms Trad said.
